Projected impact 2021–2025

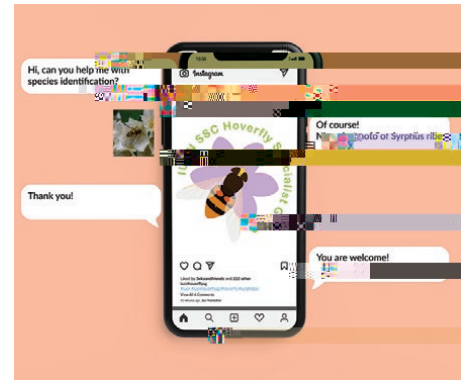
