We deliberated on advancing the conservation status assessment, acknowledging that the mortality would likely affect the status of several species.

Result description: In our focused efforts to update our Wild Penguins in Perpetuity Conservation Strategic Plan, we convened multiple meetings of the Penguin Specialist Group (PSG) Steering Committee. These sessions were dedicated to critically evaluating and enhancing our long-term conservation strategies to ensure the sustainability and health of wild penguin populations. Through these discussions, we aimed to re ne our goals, identify new conservation priorities, and adjust our action plans in response to emerging threats and scienti c ndings.
