"Likewise, an agriculture company in India can find water, biodiversity, and agriculture experts to learn about the immediate ecological challenges facing its products."

"The directory provides an opportunity for experts to share their work and improves scientific communication to decision makers," said Enrique Lahmann of IUCN.
