Background

In commemorating the World Environment Day of 5th June 2010, REASON (Rwanda Environment Awareness Services Organisation Network) organized an environment awareness week in Kigali from 10th -13th June 2010. The week's events included Lectures, debates and seminars, Environmental drama and planting of bamboo along Nyabugogo swamp in Kinamba1.

Nyabugogo swamp is a critical habitat for city biodiversity and an industrial effluent hub of wastes from Kigali City environs and Kigali industrial area. The swamp does the work of filtration and storage of the unwanted heavy metals in our environment. Plantation of bamboo will play a very big ecological role in the control of the pollution of river Nyabugogo and Nyabarongo respectively which are within Kigali city.

Background and history

REASON, a national NGO that has been operating in Rwanda since 1996, has made a steady progress in creating environmental awareness among various stakeholders including government through sensitization campaigns and advocacy. REASON's activities have been concentrated in schools and other higher institutions of learning by creating environment clubs and environmental action groups.

REASON activities started in Kigali City and later spread to other parts of the country carrying out the following activities;

- Establishment of environment clubs in schools

- Afforestation programme in the in Kigali City, Gicumbi, Kayonza, Karongi and Bugesera districts

- First to decampaign the use of plastics as a non-biodegradable material in Rwanda and the use of Asbestos as a building material

- Training of women and youth groups in the construction of the improved energy cooking stoves in the districts of Gatsibo and Nyagatare

- Training of district education officers on how to support and encourage the establishment and management of environment clubs in schools

- Training of 73 teachers from primary and secondary schools in the country

The awareness week activities will concentrate on issues of water resources, wetlands, biodiversity conservation, and education for sustainable development in Rwanda.

Aims and Objectives

To revitalize the environmental club activities in Kigali City schools and the country at large

To involve local community mobilization and media in environmental awareness raising

To raise advocacy among decision makers in the mainstreaming and adoption of ESD, (Education for Sustainable Development) in all institutions of learning and other development programmes in the country

Global theme: Many species, One planet, One future

Our theme: Biodiversity protection and conservation for sustainability

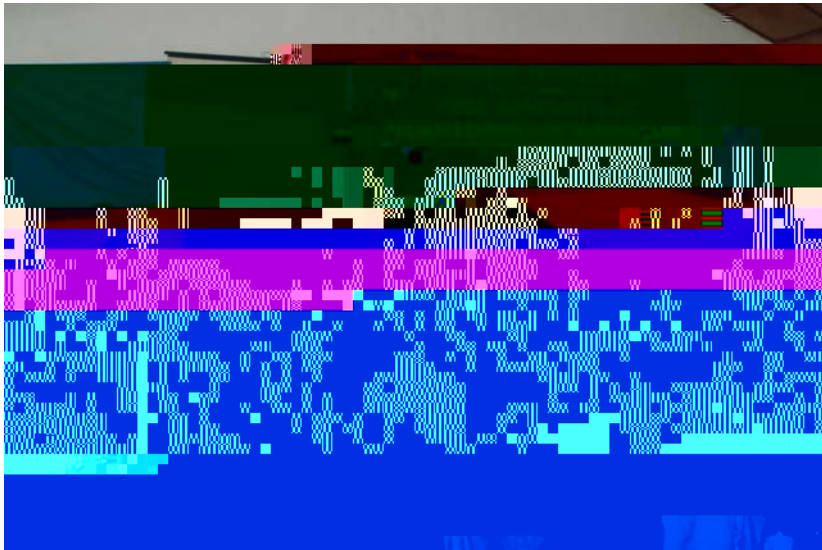
The activities of the Environment Awareness Week included;

DAY II

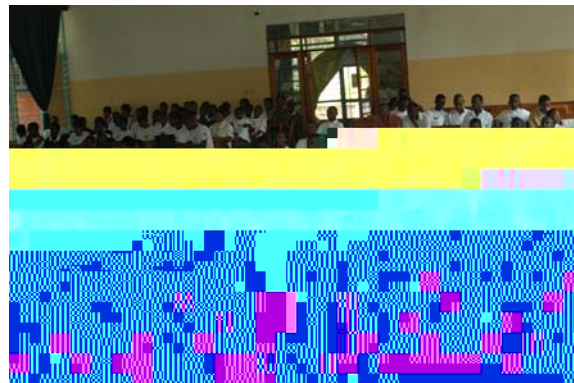
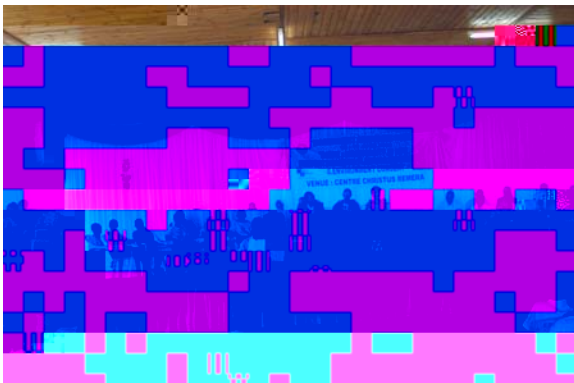

Environmental Concert

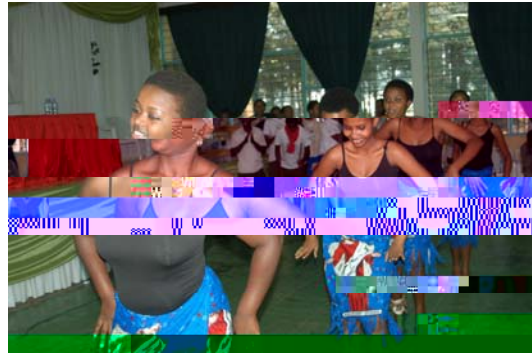
This comprised the following activities performed by 220 students from four districts of Nyarugenge, Kicukiro, Gasabo and Nyanza:

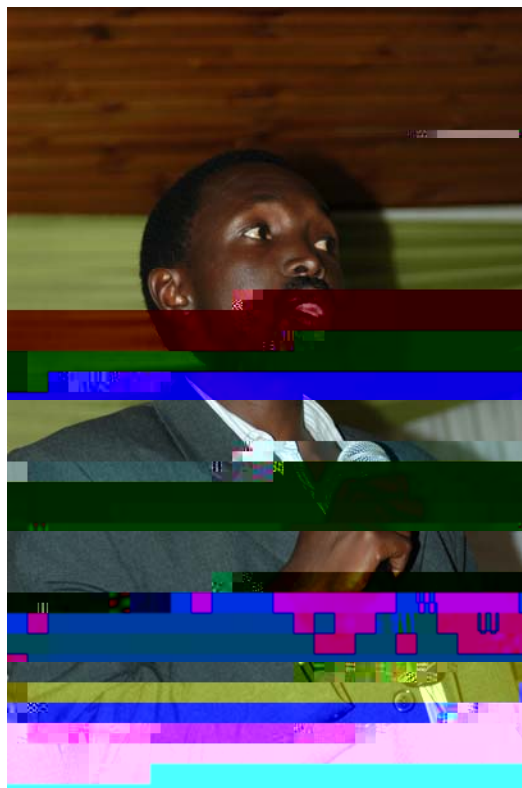

The one-day function was officiated by Mr. Africa Janvier a representative from the Catholic Relief Service in Rwanda. The function was represented by the following schools;



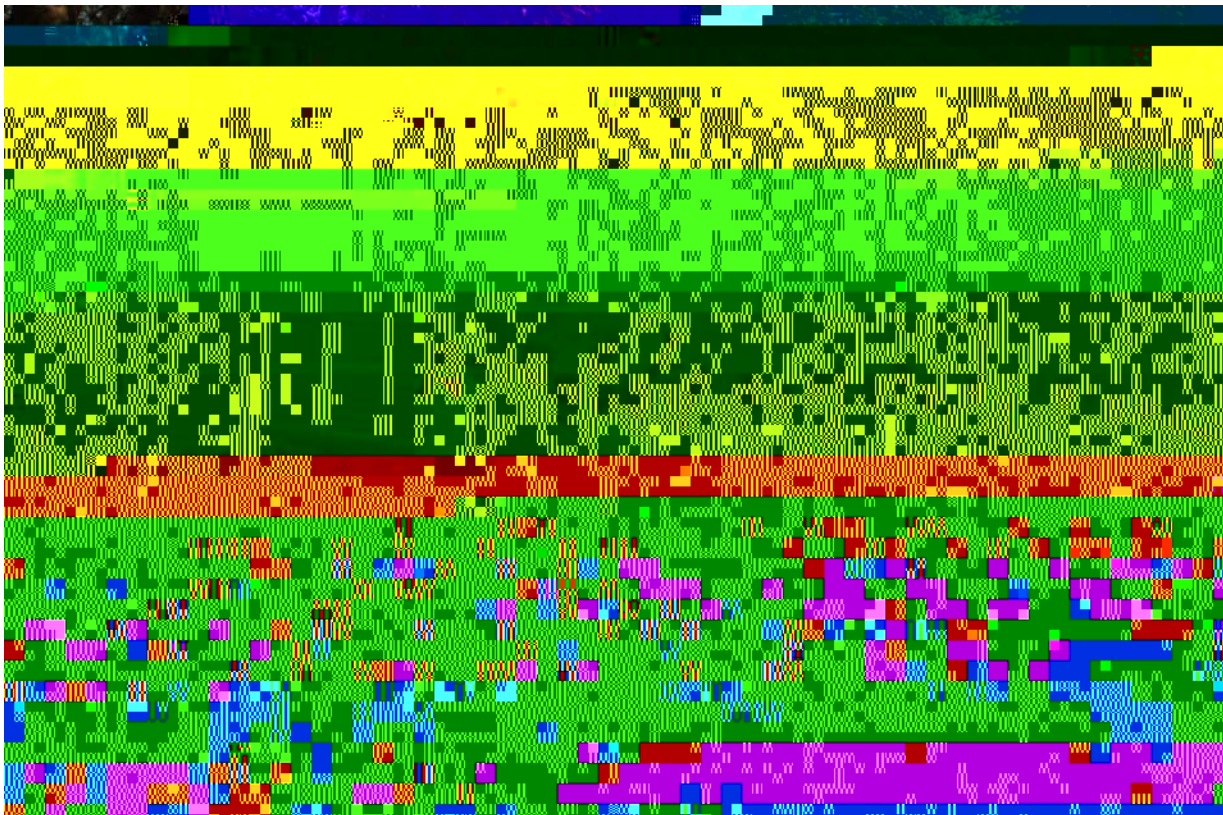
